



Centenary Badge 2010 Criteria



Each section has their own criteria to be completed to earn the badge and additional group tasks that must be completed by the whole company.

Compulsory for all Sections and to be completed as a company:

1. Photo 100!

- Take a photo of your company, in uniform, taking part in a Guiding Activity and send a copy of it to the National Office, attention Louise Browne, or via email to centenary@girlguidesireland.ie
- We will make a collage of all the photos from around the country so we need as many photos as possible! You can send in more than one photo per company but it must be a group photo.
- The Photo is to be of individual sections, ie, All Cygnets or All Guides, etc but not a mixture of both.
- Please send in your photo(s) before/by Friday 5th March 2010.



2. Celebrate Centenary Day

- Hold a centenary event in your company, unit or area. This can be held on April 10th 2010, Centenary Day, or around that date. Suggestions for events to celebrate the day will be sent out in February's Guider's Link. Also, keep an eye on the CGI website from January for updates on the Centenary and suggestions for Centenary Day or drop us an email at centenary@girlguidesireland.ie so we can keep you up to date directly.

Cygnets (can be completed individually or as a company)

1. Pick a Country from the list of countries founded in 1910 and draw/colour the flag of that country
2. Research a game played by the Cygnet age group in countries founded in 1910 and play it at your meeting

Guides (to be completed individually unless otherwise specified)

1. Complete a project on the changes in your community, country or the world, over the past 100 years.
2. Take part in a centenary message exchange with another company outside of Ireland, via the WAGGGS website or by email or post. Try to send 100 messages in total.
3. "Do a Good Deed" - Aim to commit 100 hours as a group to another voluntary organisation, organise a clean up of a local park or beach, hold a cake sale in aid of a local Hospice etc. These are just some suggestions, there are many more good deeds you can do! Log all your good deeds in a 'ladder' format with a goal of 100 rungs, one rung for every good deed done or hour volunteered.



Rangers (to be completed individually unless otherwise specified)

1. Do a project on the changing lives of women in the last 100 years and present it to a Guide company or hold a debate on the issues.



2. Take part in a centenary message exchange with another company outside of Ireland, via the WAGGGS website or by email or post. Try to send 100 messages in total.
3. "Do a Good Deed" - Aim to commit 100 hours as a group or individually to another voluntary organisation, organise a clean up of a local park or beach, hold a cake sale in aid of a local Hospice etc. These are just some suggestions, there are many more good deeds you can do! Log all your good deeds in a 'ladder' format with a goal of 100 rungs, one rung for every good deed done or hour volunteered.
