BACKGROUND

VSB has been promoting ESV for the past 10 years during which time interest has grown and more employers are taking steps towards encouraging their employees to get involved.

Employer Supported

Volunteering (ESV) occurs when companies actively support and encourage their employees in voluntary activity within the local community. It has been shown to provide significant community impact, employee development opportunities and corporate profile among many other benefits.

Research has shown that employers are supportive of employees' voluntary activities but would appreciate assistance in establishing a programme to maximise the benefits to employees, the community and the business.

VSB has established a programme to support, encourage and develop ESV (Employer Supported Volunteering) to interested parties across Northern Ireland. We provide employers and employees with opportunities to help the communities, in which they live and work. Participation can be team-orientated or individual; time limited or ongoing but above all the experience should be rewarding and meaningful and will improve the quality of life for all concerned. ESV benefits include:

- development competencies
- creative thinking & problem solving
- project management skills
- networking
- relationship building and team working skills development

ACTION DAYS

As part of this initiative VSB organise "Action Days" These events are geared to encouraging as many employees as possible to leave the constraints of their work environments and to do something positive within the community. Generally they will all meet at VSB for breakfast. T.Shirts, goody bags etc. and will then depart in their teams to a pre-chosen activity. Action Days are excellent "taster" events for ESV with a strong emphasis on volunteering, team building, and fun!

Last year VSB partnered with Business in the Community to organise a joint Action Day. Held close to St Patricks Day it was themed "Be a Saint - Volunteer!" Such was the success of the day with over 300 employees deployed around the Province undertaking activities such as painting & decorating, environmental and conservation work as well as DIY and maintenance activities that plans are underway to hold another similar event on 19th March 2010.

In the past three years VSB has helped facilitate 1491 employee volunteers to undertake 10,437 hours of volunteering within local communities.
