The Department for Social Development is currently consulting on its plans for a Volunteering Strategy to support and encourage volunteering in Northern Ireland.

We want to hear your opinion on how we can do this best.

What is volunteering?

Volunteering takes place when someone gives time to help someone else or a cause they care about, simply because they want to and without expecting a payment. Volunteers are making an important contribution to community life in Northern Ireland. Lots of people engaged in voluntary activity may not necessarily think of themselves as volunteers. Why do we need a strategy for volunteering?

Volunteers are a valuable resource, we want to recognise their contribution and encourage more people to get involved. Here are some facts¹ about volunteering.

- Over 282,000 individuals volunteer with an organisation.
- Volunteering levels in Northern Ireland since 1995 are at best static.
- Over 75% of organisations that involve volunteers could not manage without their volunteers.
- 55% of organisations are finding it more difficult to recruit volunteers.
- Work commitments are the main reason people give for not getting involved.
- Volunteers are motivated by wanting to improve things.

Volunteering has benefits for individuals, organisations and society so the Department for Social Development would like to encourage and strengthen it. We would like to involve more people in volunteering action to build a better future for everyone.

What sorts of things are being proposed?

The Department for Social Development is currently consulting on over 40 proposals which will shape a Volunteering Strategy. This leaflet summarises some of the main issues.
